 - requirement under the Older Americans Act.
 - composed of overarching goals, objectives and measures.
 - Each AAA, develops strategies to meet the objectives and measures to collectively meet the plan.
- **ARC AAA plan serves as an application to the state for funding for the upcoming year FY23 as well as an update to the goals the state set. It Includes**
 - the regional provision of services and providers and
 - Formal request for funding (FY23 Planning Allocation) DAS

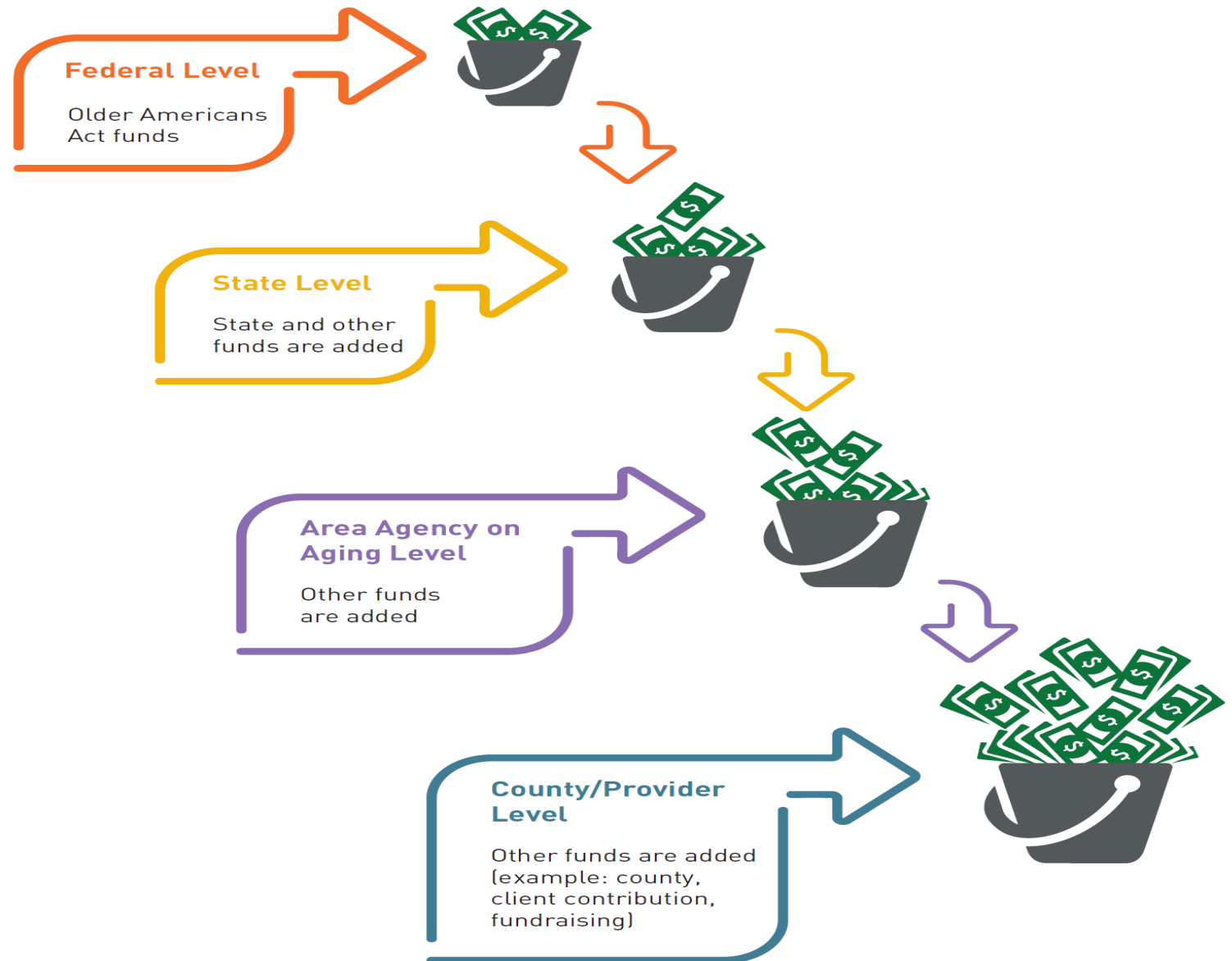

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How Older Americans Act Seed Money Grows



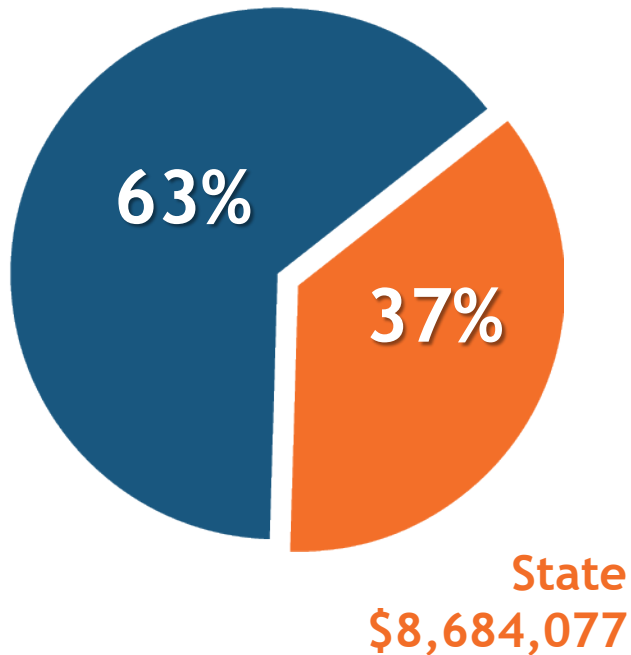


FY 2022/FY 2023 Comparison

State & OAA: \$22,575,135

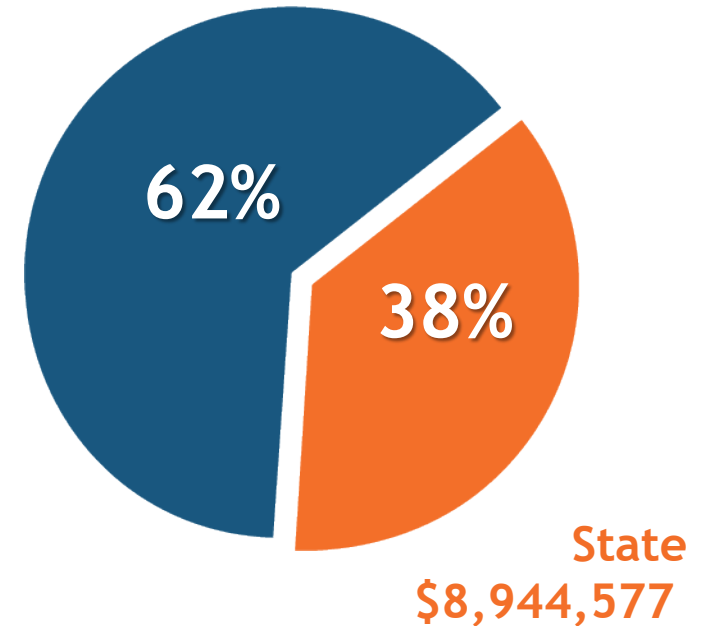
