- Florida has not proved:
  - the collapse of its oyster fisheries was caused by Georgia's overconsumption
  - Georgia's overconsumption has harmed river wildlife and plant life
- "We must overrule Florida's exceptions to the Special Master's Report and dismiss the case."




#### Infrastructure Challenges

While we receive abundant rain most years, multi-year droughts stress our water supply and have become more frequent.

























