Program Objectives

Provide safe, sustainable, and affordable transportation options to Atlanta residents, especially working families and low-income individuals

Connect residents to jobs and opportunities

Reduce vehicle miles traveled (VMT)

Reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions

Understand the impact of e-bikes on low-income communities

Understand how e-bikes affect commuter behavior

Deliver program that addresses climate change, equity, and sustainability, and scales regionally

Program Partners















The City of Atlanta approved a \$1 million e-bike rebate program to provide reliable, affordable, and sustainable transportation options to combat climate change and rising transportation costs.

Program Overview

- **75%** of rebate funds for income qualified participants (80% AMI)
- 800 1,000 new e-bike riders in City of Atlanta
- \$500 \$2,000 rebates divided into four types
- Point-of-sale rebate


Primary Target Audience

- Moderate- to Low-Income Residents
- Transit Dependent Populations
- Zero-Car to One-Car Households

Prospective E-Bike Retailers

- Brick-and-mortar stores within city limits
- Must sell e-bikes at the physical location
- Must be able to service e-bikes on-site

Proposed Application Process

E-Bike Rebate Participant Journey

- 1 Register for E-Bike Rebate Program
- Simple process
- Enter name, address, and email, and rebate type
- Clear program rules and eligibility

- Randomly
 Select
 through
 Lottery
- ARC randomly selects registrants who will be invited to apply
- 3 Participant Completes Application Process
- Selected applicants provide required documentation for rebate type
- 4 Review
 Applications
 and Award
 Rebates
- Distribute rebate codes
- Provide list of participating bike shops
- Propel ATL follows up with resources

- 5 Participant Redeems Rebate at Bike Shop
- 90-day expiration
- Deactivate rebates at point of sale
- Bike shop invoices ARC for reimbursement

6 Participant Receives E-Bike

- Completes survey
- Signs up for GCO
- Receives helmet
- Signs up for Propel ATL bike ed class and resources





Proposed Timeline

Q1 2024

- Kick-off meeting with stakeholders.
- Develop marketing materials and strategies.
- Finalize contracts and agreements with local bike shops.
- Start community outreach programs and workshops.
- Set up lottery system for rebate disbursement.
- Train staff on the lottery system and application process.
- Finalize online application portal.



Q2 2024

- Launch the City of Atlanta E-Bike Rebate Program
 Earth Day: April 22, 2024
- Accept/close registration for the spring lottery.
- Conduct lottery and select applicants.
- Review and disburse rebates to verified applicants.
- Process disbursements to bike shops for spring winners.






