2. ARC Community Planning Academy Update

Since 2002, ARC's Community Planning Academy (CPA) has offered high-quality, cost-effective training to Metro Atlanta planners charged with creating positive change in their communities. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, ARC staff pivoted from the standard in-person training in the spring to an all-virtual fall program that also includes larger programmatic changes. The Mobility Services Group is developing a series of reports and data analysis tools that aim to provide an understanding of equity as it relates to commuting, looking at the relationships among equitable target areas, the residential locations of workers in specific industries, differential access to transportation infrastructure, and mobility in the Atlanta Region. Understanding differences in mobility and access to transportation infrastructure among the working population in our region is key to addressing equity issues through TDM.

5. Listening to Pandemic Voices: Metro Atlanta Speaks 2020

ARC's eighth annual Metro Atlanta Speaks (MAS) public opinion survey was completed in late August. A "different" 2020 demanded a different question set than the typical one, for the survey. The targeted topics this year were: (a) the economic and public health impacts of COVID-19 on our region's residents, and (b) the "pandemic pulse" of respondents on race relations. The "headlines" of the 2020 survey will be unveiled on Friday, November 13, and there will be a MAS panel discussion at the State of the Region breakfast that morning.
