EPA's Climate Pollution Reduction Grants

- \$4.6 billion in competitive funding
 - Local governments are eligible
 - Coalitions are encouraged
- Awarded for a 5-year period
- No match required
- ▶ Due April 1, 2024; ~115 awards
- Selection by the United States Environmental Protection Agency
- Strategies must be in Priority Climate Action Plan to be eligible (due March 1st)







Enhanced Green Communities Program



- Green Communities
 - Developed in 2009
 - Recognizes local governments that invest in programs and policies that lead to a more sustainable region
- Build upon existing successful program proof of concept exists!
- Focused on climate mitigation
- Expanded ability to provide technical assistance to local governments
- Targeted engagement to low-income and disadvantaged communities
- Connect local governments to related workforce development & funding opportunities





Enhanced Green Communities Program



- Requested Amount: Between \$2M \$10M
- Period of Performance: 5 years
- Funding would <u>potentially</u> support (annually):
 - 4 Full Time Staff to provide technical support, outreach, and necessary follow-up
 - 3-5 Fellows, including dedicated engagement of Low Income and Disadvantaged Communities
 - Expanded education and outreach campaign, including regional conferences/summits
 - "Seed-funding" to support participating communities to take actions
 - Local Government Certification and Recognition





E-Bike and Transportation Incentives Program

- Build upon emerging ARC program
- Expand e-bike rebate program to region and potentially statewide partners
- Dedicate 75% of rebate funds for lowincome and disadvantaged communities
- Partner with outreach, health, and workforce development organizations
- Exploring Universal Basic Mobility pilot to fund additional transportationrelated expenses







E-Bike and Transportation Incentives Program

- Requested Amount: Between \$10M \$50M
- Period of Performance: 5 years
- Funding would <u>potentially</u> support (annually):
 - Up to 10,000 E-bike riders in Metro Atlanta
 - Partnerships dedicated to Low-Income and Disadvantaged Communities engagement
 - Partnerships and coordination with retailers at regional and statewide level
 - Expanded education and outreach campaigns, classes, and resources
 - Thorough evaluation and reporting methods to capture environmental, economic, and public health outcomes
