
# Reconnecting Communities Pilot Program: \$195 million nationally in FY 2022 (discretionary funding through USDOT - Office of the Secretary)

Program Purpose:	Awarded on a competitive basis for projects that reconnect communities by removing, retrofitting, or mitigating highways or other transportation facilities that create barriers to community connectivity, including to mobility, access, or economic development.
Eligibility:	The project must address an "eligible facility" that creates a barrier to community connectivity, including barriers to mobility, access, or economic development. Eligible facilities include: <b>limited access highways</b> , viaducts, <b>any other principal arterial facilities</b> , and other facilities such as <b>transit lines</b> , <b>rail lines</b> , gas pipelines, and airports.
Non-Federal Match Requirements:	<u>Planning Grants</u> : 20% <u>Capital Construction</u> : 50% - but other federal sources can raise this to 80%
Key Notes:	Project evaluation includes four "merit criteria:" 1) Equity, Environmental Justice, and Community Engagement, 2) Mobility and Community Connectivity, 3) Community-based Stewardship, Management, and Partnerships, and 4) Equitable Development and Shared Prosperity

Reconnecting Communities Pilot Program Applications must be submitted by 11:59 PM EDT on Thursday, October 13, 2022





### Railroad Crossing Elimination Program: \$573 million nationally (discretionary funding through USDOT - Federal Railroad Administration)

Program Purpose:	Awarded on a competitive basis for projects that create grade separations – such as overpasses and underpasses – as well as closures, track relocations, and improvement or installation of warning devices at crossings if related to a separation or relocation project.
Eligibility:	Grade separation or closure, including through the use of a bridge, embankment, tunnel, or combination thereof; track relocation; the improvement or installation of protective devices, signals, signs, or other measures the improve safety, provided that such activities are related to a separation or relocation project
Non-Federal Match Requirements:	Planning Grants: 20%  Implementation Grants: 20%
Key Notes:	Project proposals are evaluated based on their potential to improve safety by eliminating crossings or improving existing highway-rail grade crossings; increase access to emergency services; reduce emissions; provide economic benefit; and hire locally, among other possible community enhancements.


#### Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A): \$1 billion nationally (discretionary funding through USDOT - Office of the Secretary)

Program Purpose:	Awarded on a competitive basis to support planning, infrastructure, behavioral, and operational initiatives to prevent death and serious injury on roads and streets involving all roadway users, including pedestrians; bicyclists; public transportation, personal conveyance, and micromobility users; motorists; and commercial vehicle operators.
Eligibility:	<ul> <li>Develop or update a comprehensive safety action plan (Action Plan).</li> <li>Conduct planning, design, and development activities in support of an Action Plan.</li> <li>Carry out projects and strategies identified in an Action Plan.</li> </ul>
Non-Federal Match Requirements:	Action Plan Grants: 20%  Implementation Grants: 20%
Key Notes:	Project proposals are evaluated based on Safety Impact; Equity, Engagement, and Collaboration; Effective Practices and Strategies; Climate Change and Sustainability, and Economic Competitiveness; and Project Readiness



#### Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A): \$1 billion nationally (discretionary funding through USDOT - Office of the Secretary)

Safe Streets and Roads for All Program Applications must be submitted by <u>5:00 p.m.</u> EDT on September 15, 2022






# Bridge Investment Program: \$2.36 billion nationally (discretionary funding through USDOT - Federal Highway Administration)

Awarded on a competitive basis to improve the safety, efficiency, and reliability of the movement of people and freight by replacing, rehabilitating, preserving, and protecting bridges.
The project must Project to replace, rehabilitate, preserve, or protect one or more bridges on the National Bridge Inventory.
Typically will be 20% non-federal but is 10% for off-system bridges
Project proposals are evaluated based on their impacts to:  • State of Good Repair  • Safety  • Mobility and Economic Competitiveness  • Climate Change, Resiliency, and the Environment  • Quality of Life and Innovation
