 will be confirmed January 9th

New Lieutenant Governor

Sen. Burt Jones (R-25, Jackson)

Republicans retained their majorities in both Chambers

• House: 101 – 79

• Senate: 33 – 23

- Would bring Georgia code in line with federal code by allowing for Board meetings to be held by teleconference
- Georgia Workforce Leadership Association (GWLA) working with Madam Chair Darlene Taylor on possible 2023 legislation

- Bill expected this year...
