






Basics of the MTP/TIP Update Process

- Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) spans 20+ years;
 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is the first four years of the MTP
- Both must be updated every four years
- Last update approved in February 2020
 - Eight amendments and regular quarterly administration modifications have been processed since then
- Must meet all federal metropolitan planning requirements, including fiscal constraint and air quality conformity





Sources of Funding for the Plan

Funding Source	Estimated Revenue thru 2050
Federal (Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act)	\$43.7 billion (25.5%)
State (Motor fuel tax; user fees; lodging fee)	\$52.6 billion (30.7%)
Local (Sales taxes; general funds; transit fares)	\$73.8 billion (43.1%)
Other (Community Improvement Districts; private)	\$1.2 billion (0.7%)
TOTAL AVAILABLE	\$171.3 billion

KEY TAKEAWAY

Only about one-fourth of the plan's funding is from federal sources. The region and state directly funds the majority of its needs.






How Funds Will Be Invested

KEY TAKEAWAY

Nearly 4 out of every 5 dollars are needed to maintain and operate an to maximize its efficient use. Only about 1 dollar in 5 is available to add significant transit and road capacity.



Public Engagement Highlights



- Public participation process summarized in Volume IV.
- Over 71,000 public "touchpoints" have informed MTP since February 2020.
- Formal public comment period was held from October 27 to December 8, 2023; responses contained in Appendix of Vol IV.
- Climate change, funding priorities and an uncertain future were common themes of comments.
- Some modifications to MTP Vol 1 to address specific comments were made.
