



What is the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)?

- Short range element (6 years) of Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)
- Current TIP FY 2020-2025
- Fiscally constrained
- Phases with federal funds required to be in TIP (includes federal discretionary fund award grants)
- Phase dates follow State fiscal year (July 1 to June 30)
- 100% local funded capacity projects required to be in TIP and ARC travel demand model coding (not exempt from air quality analysis)

- Electric Vehicle Registration Fees (<\$0.1B)</p>
- General Fund Appropriations (\$0.4B)
- SPLOST Revenue (\$14.3B)
- T-SPLOST Revenue (\$8.2B)
- MARTA Sales Tax Revenue (\$24.6B)
- MARTA Farebox and Other Revenue (\$7.2B)
- City and County General Funds (\$18.0B)
- Non-MARTA Transit Agency Revenue (\$2.8B)
- CID and Other Revenue (\$2.0B)

Federal Fund Sources

- ARC Programming Authority
 - Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program Urban (Pop >200K) (Z230)
 - Approximately \$80 million-\$83 million per fiscal year
 - Transportation Alternatives (TAP) Program Urban (Pop >200K) (Z301)
 - Approximately \$7 million per fiscal year
 - Congestion Mitigation & Air Quality (CMAQ) Program* (Z400)
 - Approximately \$29 million per fiscal year

^{*}Programming authority under GDOT but ARC conducts project call on their behalf


TIP Amendment #2

2019 TIP Solicitation

- Project call for three regional federal fund programs:
 - Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Urban
 - Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ)
 - Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP)
- Application period closed in October 2019
- Technical evaluation and application review conducted late 2019 into early 2020
- First round programmed during TIP Amendment #1 (September 2020)
 - focused on programming more immediate fiscal year phases
- Second round focused on programming FY 2023 phases and beyond

Funding Request Summary

- Requested Total Funding*
 - Study Applications = \$12.5 M
 - Roadway Requests = \$298 M
 - Active Modes Requests = \$291M
 - Transit Requests = \$86.1M
 - Misc. Requests = \$1.5M
- Asset Management vs. Expansion
 - Asset Management = \$108.9M
 - System Expansion = \$179.2M



TIP Amendment #2 Changes

- 2019 TIP Project Solicitation
 - Program projects new to the TIP
 - Fund source conversion from 100% local to 80% federal/20% local
- Other Financial Changes
 - Addition of new federal funded phase
 - Conversion of phase fund source from state to federal
 - Federal share cost estimate increase beyond threshold to qualify for an administrative modification

- 20-Day Public Comment Period January 14, 2021 to February 11, 2021
- ARC Committee and Board Action
 - TCC March 5, 2021
 - TAQC & ARC Board March 10, 2021
- GRTA Action March 10, 2021
- Review and Updated Conformity Determination from US DOT and US EPA – April 2021
