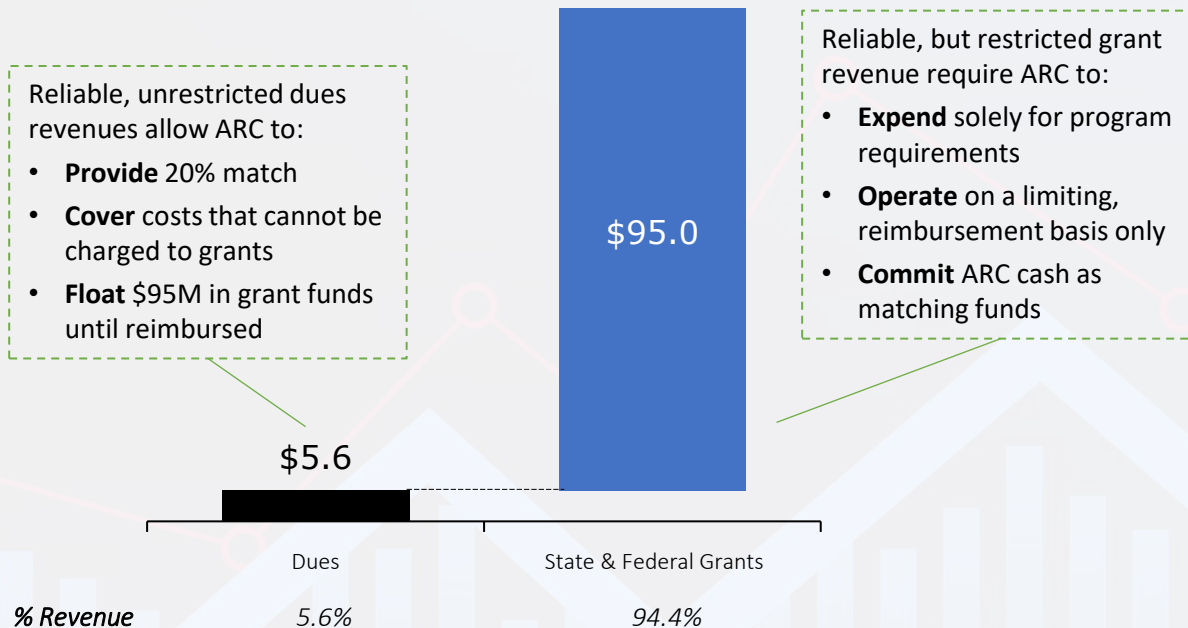

Executive Summary

- ARC is working hard to prepare the region for **transformative infrastructure investments** and broader economic development.
- The agency **needs more resources** to fulfill its evolving mission.
- We are exploring both near-term and long-term unconstrained **revenue-generating strategies**.
- **A CPI-driven dues increase** to support ARC and its regional objectives for member jurisdictions **is timely and needed**.

ARC Revenues, by Source



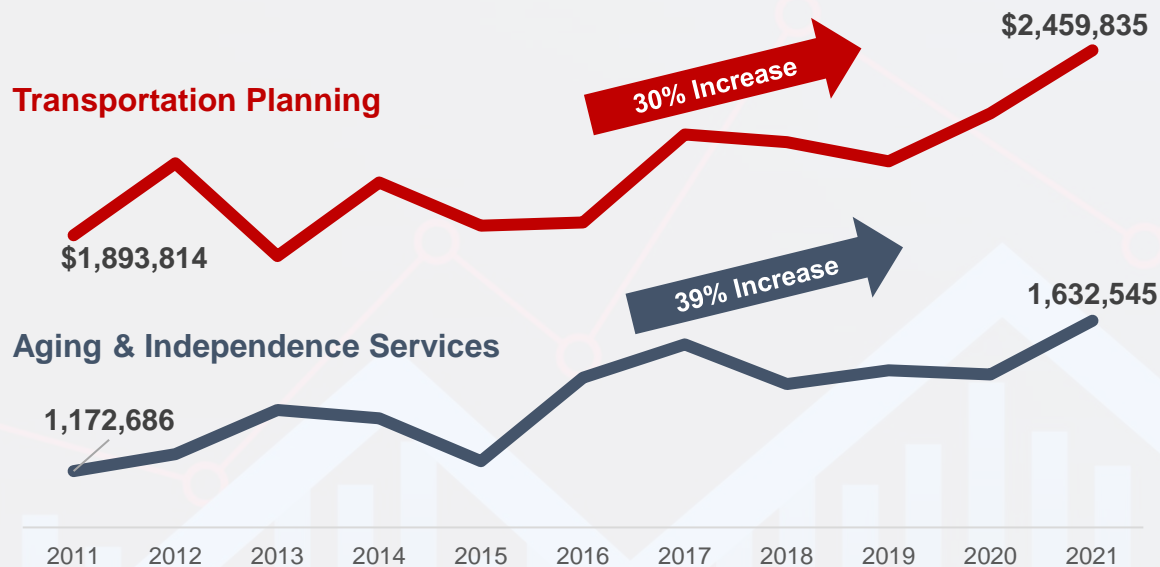
Financial Overview

- Dues are the **Agency's working capital** to provide the required match to federal and state grants.
- Dues **also cover internal programs** (such as natural resources, legislative support, and leadership programming).
- ARC **leverages much of its \$5M in dues to invest \$100M** for Metro Atlanta (~20x multiple).

The current dues level creates cash flow challenges and limits flexibility to pursue additional funding for the region

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Delayed Revenue:

- Dues have not kept pace with increased match requirements over the last decade

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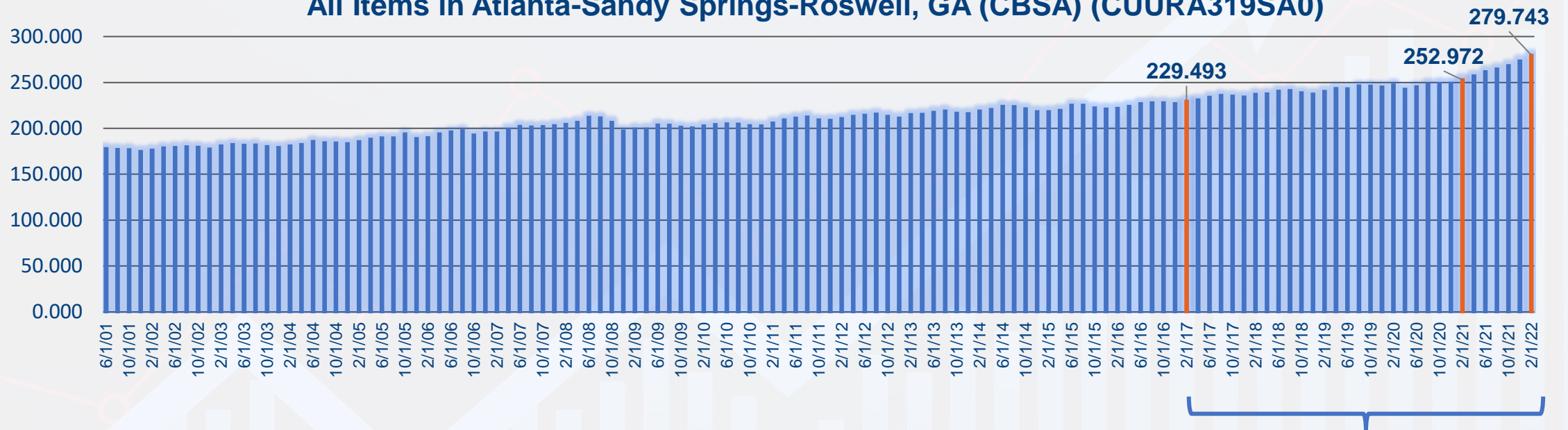
Unanticipated Expenses:

- Bipartisan infrastructure bill passed after adoption of 2022 ARC budget, so required match became an unbudgeted expense
- Increased costs to implement internal and leadership programs
- Increased local TSPLOST revenues have required more ARC support to execute local projects

An increase in dues is timely and needed

O.C.G.A 50-8-101 authorizes the ARC Board to implement a dues increase each time the Consumer Price Index (CPI) raises by 10%+

Since January 2017, the date of the last increase, the CPI increased 21.9%.

A CPI-driven increase would raise \$500K for ARC

The increase will support new regional investments

- Implement ARC's comprehensive engagement strategy for billions in new, formula and discretionary infrastructure funds for the Metro Atlanta Region
- Meet the match requirement for the \$15M in new infrastructure dollars to which ARC is directly entitled for its transportation planning work
- Coordinate a construction-sector workforce development initiative to help ensure execution of infrastructure capital funds
- Pursue discretionary funding opportunities

Next Step to implement the CPI-driven increase

- Approve – July 2022 meeting of the ARC board
- Complete – July Population Estimates
 - Finalize the required update to jurisdictional population figures used to calculate dues rates
 - Apply increase from \$1.10 per capita to \$1.20 per capita to the new population estimates
- Implement dues increase with a January 1, 2023 effective date
