



Our goal is to update our Regional Active Transportation Facility Inventory!





- What are we including?
 - Existing facilities
 - Trails
 - Side paths, multi-use paths, park trails
 - 8 feet wide or greater
 - Bike lanes
 - Protected, buffered, and conventional
 - 4 feet wide or greater

Fields for each existing facility

- Name
- Specification (Note type)
- Facility Type (Bike Lane, Protected Bike Lane, Multi-Use Path)
- Construction Year
- Construction Material
- City
- County
- Width (feet)
- Length (feet)
- Length (miles)



- Where have we pulled facility data from so far?
 - 2022 inventory as our starting point to build upon
 - County GIS portals
 - City GIS portals and City requests
 - AllTrails KMZ files
 - PATH foundation GIS files
 - Campus Facility Maps
 - Google Maps (trails & dedicated lanes)







- What do we need from you?

 - Are there facilities missing that need to be added?


