Goal

Strategic investments in people, infrastructure, mobility, and preserving natural resources.

Improving Mobility in Douglas

\$50 million in federal and state funds allocated by ARC through 2028 to improve transportation across Douglas County. Key projects include:

- Lee Road/South Sweetwater Road Widening Lee Road/South Sweetwater Road will be widened between Vulcan Road and Skyview Road to add two lanes, with a multi-use trail on the shoulder.
- Chattahoochee Hill Country Regional Greenway Trail Funding is provided for the final design of the Douglas County portion of the Chattahoochee Hill Country Regional Greenway Trail System. This project will connect the county's pilot trail system segment in Boundary Waters Park to Sweetwater Creek State Park.
- Dallas Highway Corridor Improvements A one-mile shared use path and a new median island will run from Brown Street to the proposed McCarley Street railroad crossing, serving to slow vehicular traffic and improve safety for pedestrians.

559.217 fewer miles traveled by the **146 Douglas residents** who participated in the Georgia Commute Options program, saving them \$349,511 in fuel and vehicle maintenance costs.



Securing a Sustainable Future

The Metropolitan North Georgia Water District, which is managed by ARC, adopted an update to the Water Resources Management Plan that improves the Atlanta region's resilience to droughts by enhancing conservation education efforts and enabling the region's water providers to enforce state-issued drought restrictions. An effective early response could mitigate the need for more stringent watering restrictions during a severe drought.

Making Douglas an Even Better Place to Live, Work, and Play

\$120,000 Livable Centers Initiative Grant

to **Douglas County** for the **Highway 92 LCI Update**, which will study the Highway 92 corridor between I-20 and Lee Road to reflect the area's growth and development. The update will target mobility, livability, placemaking, smart technology, and housing goals informed by community outreach.



Dallas Highway Corridor Improvements

ARC has allocated funding to the **City of Douglasville** for a multi-use path and safety improvements on a 1-mile stretch of Dallas Highway, between Brown Street and McCarley Street railroad crossing. The project, funded through ARC's **Livable Centers Initiative**, features median islands for safer pedestrian crossings and reduced lane widths and a roundabout at the Upshaw Mill Road intersection to reduce traffic speeds.
