Improving Mobility in Fayette

\$18 million in federal and state funds allocated by ARC through 2028 to improve transportation across Fayette County. Key projects include:



- The Coastline Road Bridge The Coastline Road Bridge over freight railroad tracks will be replaced due to structural deficiencies and age.
- The SR 279 Realignment Two intersections SR 279 at SR 85 and SR 85 at the East Fayetteville Bypass will be realigned to improve commuter and freight traffic. The project eliminates a traffic signal on SR 85 and prevents dangerous weaving patterns on SR 85 between the two intersections.

600,173 fewer miles traveled by the **116 Fayette residents** who participated in the **Georgia Commute Options** program, saving them **\$375,108** in fuel and vehicle maintenance costs.



Securing a Sustainable Future

The **Metropolitan North Georgia Water District**, which is managed by ARC, adopted an update to the Water Resources Management Plan that **improves the Atlanta region's resilience** to droughts by enhancing conservation education efforts and enabling the region's water providers to enforce state-issued drought restrictions. An effective early response could mitigate the need for more stringent watering restrictions during a severe drought.

\$160,000 Livable Centers Initiative Grant

to the **Town of Tyrone** for the **Town Center Streetscape & Mobility Schematic Project**, which intends to create a livable and sustainable town center in Tyrone along Senoia Road through creative placemaking, multimodal mobility, smart technology, and planning and environmental design best practices. The study will work towards community revitalization, modernization, and sustainability through streetscape design guidelines, street construction standards, creative placemaking, and integrated smart technology.

 - 5 Fayette County youth received training through WorkSource Atlanta Regional's youth providers and in the Work Experience program.





Securing a Competitive Economic Future
