Goal

Improving Mobility in Gwinnett

\$440 million in federal and state funds allocated by ARC through 2028 to improve transportation across Gwinnett County. Key projects include:

- **Evermore North Boulevard Extension** This 1-mile project in the Snellville area will provide additional east-west connectivity and ease congestion on U.S. 78.
- I-85 North/McGinnis Ferry Road Interchange Funding has been allocated for Phase 1 of this project, which will create an important freight corridor between I-85 and Georgia 400.
- Gwinnett Satellite Corridor BRT ARC has allocated funding to study the environmental impact of proposed bus-only lanes on Satellite Boulevard between Jimmy Carter Blvd. and the Sugarloaf Mills Park and Ride lot.

4 million fewer miles traveled by the 1,006 Gwinnett residents who participated in the Georgia Commute Options program, saving them \$2.5 million in fuel and vehicle maintenance costs.



Securing a Sustainable Future

The Metropolitan North Georgia Water District, which is managed by ARC, adopted an update to the Water Resources Management Plan that improves the Atlanta region's resilience to droughts by enhancing conservation education efforts and enabling the region's water providers to enforce state-issued drought restrictions. An effective early response could mitigate the need for more stringent watering restrictions during a severe drought.

provided to the **City of Lawrenceville** for the **Honest Alley Activation project**, which aims to study the potential transformation of Honest Alley in the city's downtown into a vibrant, pedestrian-friendly destination that sparks economic development and improves quality of life.



City of Suwanee Roundabout Master Plan

The **City of Suwanee** will work with ARC staff to build upon the 2015 Downtown Suwanee Master Plan Update to develop a vision for an activity node at the intersection of Buford Highway and Russell Street to better connect the Old Town and Suwanee Town Center. This project, part ARC's Community Development Assistance Program, will guide desired downtown land uses based on market studies and inform design guidelines for future buildings and public spaces in the area.
